Hello Gentlemen,



General Friedrich Wilhelm von Steuben

Friedrich Wilhelm von Steuben was born September 17, 1730 in Magdeburg, Prussia, now Germany. His father, a Lieutenant, was a military engineer. Young von Steuben served as a volunteer with his father in 1744 during the War of Austrian Succession. In 1746, he entered the Prussian Army.

Originally an infantryman, his skills at organization led him to become a staff officer. In 1761, he was promoted to Captain, seeing service in the Seven Years War. He became aide-de-camp on Frederick the Great's staff, receiving specialized warfare training. At wars end, the army was downsized and von Steuben was unemployed.

In 1764, von Steuben was appointed chamberlain to Josef Friedrich Wilhelm of Hohenzollern-Hechingen and later was made a knight of the Order of Fidelity, when von Steuben began using the title "Baron".

Looking for new employment, Baron von Steuben travelled to Paris in 1777 where he met with French Minister of War, Claude Louis, Comte de Saint-Germain, who recommended him to Benjamin Franklin. Benjamin Franklin, Arthur Lee, and Silas Deane were American commissioners to France. After an extended period, von Steuben was given letters of introduction and passage to America.

On February 5, 1778, von Steuben met the Continental Congress. Accepting his service as a volunteer, von Steuben was sent to join General George Washington and the Continental Army at Valley Forge. Franklin's letter of introduction described von Steuben as a Lieutenant General in the King of Prussia's service, an exaggeration.

Communicating with von Steuben proved difficult as a translator was required, but Washington wished to take advantage of von Steuben's experience, and in early March, asked him to serve as Inspector General, overseeing the training and discipline of the army. Beginning with a model company of 100 soldiers, von Steuben instructed them in drill, maneuver, and a simplified manual of arms (through interpreters). These men were then sent to other units of the army to provide training and instruction until the entire army was trained. Von Steuben introduced a system of progressive training for new recruits. Von Steuben re-introduced the use of the bayonet as a fighting weapon. Additionally, he reorganized the camps, including repositioning kitchens and latrines to greatly improve sanitation.

General Washington was impressed with von Steuben's work and successfully petitioned Congress to permanently appoint von Steuben Inspector General with the rank and pay of a Major General.

During the winter of 1778–1779, von Steuben prepared *Regulations for the Order and Discipline of the Troops of the United States*, which outlined training courses and administrative procedures. In numerous editions, this work remained in use until the War of 1812.

In 1780, von Steuben sat on the courtmartial of the British Major John André, captured and charged with espionage in conjunction with the defection of General Benedict Arnold.

In November 1780, von Steuben was sent to Virginia to mobilize forces in

support of Major General Nathanael Greene's army. For various reasons, von Steuben struggled in this post and was replaced by the Marquis de Lafayette in April 1781. After some service, von Steuben took sick leave later that summer.

On September 13, 1781 he rejoined Washington's army, commanding a division at the Battle of Yorktown. His men were in the trenches when the British offer to surrender was received.

Von Steuben gave assistance to Washington in demobilizing the army in 1783 and helped plan for the future defense of the nation. He was discharged from the military with honor on March 24, 1784.

He became an American citizen by act of the Pennsylvania legislature.

Von Steuben established residency in New York. Congress ultimately granted him a pension of \$2500.

General von Steuben died at Utica, New York on November 28, 1794.
