The new year starts off with a bang.

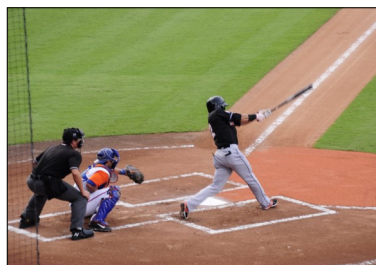

Habitat for Humanity



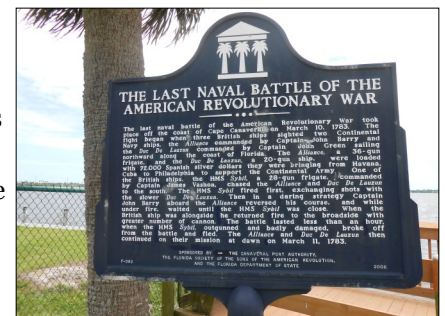
On May 23rd and May 27th, the St. Lucie River Chapter, SAR had the pleasure to participate in dedication ceremonies for Habitat for Humanity in Indiantown and Hobe Sound. Compatriots Jay Wise and Joe Regan attended the ceremonies and presented new United States Flags, flagpole brackets, booklets on displaying the flag properly, and copies of the United States Constitution to the new homeowners. The houses were built on lots donated by a local bank and were constructed by a local building contractor with the help of Habitat staff and volunteers. The lots previously had buildings of some type on them that were razed and cleared to build the new homes.



Last Naval Battle Wreath Laying Ceremony



Compatriots Hall Riediger, Jay Wise, Chuck McKinley attended a wreath laying ceremony at the site of the Memorial for the Last Revolution Naval Battle of March 10, 1783 at the Merritt Island Veterans Park on May 17th. SAR President General Lindsey Brock, his family, and many past President Generals and current officers of the SAR organization were bussed from a ship in Port Canaveral for the ceremony. The Brevard SAR Chapter under the leadership of Past President Steve Williams and Chairman Ben Dubose coordinated with local DAR chapters and the American Legion color guard to highlight the activities. FLSSAR Color Guard Commander Charles Day was in attendance and organized the compatriots in uniform to assemble in a formation with the National tour members who had on our Blue Blazers with patches in a formation for pictures. Their spouses on the tour stood in the general audience. A wonderful display of mostly Revolutionary period flags provided the background around the marker and cannon. The Pledge of Allegiance and the Pledge to the SAR were given, the laying of the wreath was accomplished, followed by remarks by President Brock thanking us for our attendance, and then a history of the Naval battle was given by his son Lindsey Brock III. The ceremony closed with the Legion Color guard firing a salute to end the program. At the conclusion of the ceremony, the travelers boarded their bus back to the ship to start the next leg of their journey to Nassau in the Bahamas to have a similar ceremony at Fort Montagu, where the Ministry of Tourism would host a brief reenactment of the Battle of Nassau, and to lay a wreath and present medals to Bahamian Officials. For your information, the Battle of Nassau took place on March 3-4, 1776 at Fort Montagu.

A reading of "I Am the Flag" by Ruth Apperson Rous was given by Chapter Compatriots, followed by Jack Irvin who gave a short talk about the SAR being a heritage organization and who described the patriots of individual chapter attendees, including their State and type of service rendered.

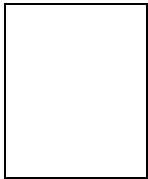
