Gold Star Family Monument Activity



Activity is continuing for the preparation and installation of the Gold Star Family Monument at Veterans Memorial Park in Port St. Lucie. The St. Lucie River Chapter, SAR donated funds to help defray the cost of the monument. Additionally, the Chapter sponsored holes for the UVSLC Gold Star Golf Tournament, whose proceeds partly went to fund the monument. Based on a recent UVSLC meeting, the marble has arrived. We are awaiting the schedule for completion activities, and an email will be sent out for all to attend the ceremony if possible. This is the second monument of its kind in Florida and the only one on our coast.

DAR Colonial Attire Presentation

On April 13th, Hall Riediger, St. Lucie River Chapter, SAR Director-at-large and Color Guard Commander, gave a wonderful briefing to the Cora Stickney Harper Chapter, DAR in Fort Pierce about the significance of colonial attire with samples provided. Attending in various uniforms were Compatriots Carl Wade, Jack Irvin, Joe Regan, and Chuck McKinley. The Compatriots attended the DAR meeting and had a fine luncheon. A highlight of the meeting was the Missing Man Table, a presentation which detailed the significance of items placed on the table. An MIA from WWII was selected. If you have the opportunity to observe one of these, it is very heartwarming, and you will find one in all American Legion facilities and Elks clubs around the nation.

Compatriots Assist in Northport K-8 Anniversary



Compatriots Jack Irvin and Chuck McKinley participated in the 30th Anniversary of the Northport K-8 School on March 7th. Concurrently the school participated in the anniversary of Dr. Seuss's Books and his 112th birthday at the same time, highlighting his emphasis on reading. Participants included a County Commissioner, Port Saint Lucie Council members, the Port Saint Lucie Police Department, and several County Veterans Organizations. School staff assigned groups of two or three persons who were escorted to

classrooms, usually by students. In these rooms, we were to read two or three books and give the history of Dr. Seuss and his foundation of learning to read at an early age. We participated in two different sessions, the first being twenty minutes and was short due to the schedule. The second was for forty minutes. Compatriot Irvin gave the history of Dr. Seuss, a short talk about his education, the importance of reading as he progressed through the educational process, and the importance of teachers and the use of reading in achieving his goal. Compatriot McKinley did likewise. We answered questions about our life's work and military careers, as well as our learning the history of our great nation and the importance of reading in attaining personal goals for a successful life. All in all, it was very successful for us to participate and give back to the community by supporting this school. The event is held on an annual basis and personnel from various veterans and public figures are invited to participate. At the introduction, we were told about MOH awardee Woody Williams's trip to the school and his participation in a similar educational exercise during his recent visit to Port Saint Lucie and dedication to the Gold Star Mothers Monument dedication. MOH awardee Williams emphasized the importance of reading to the students during his visit. Chapter members will participate in this worthwhile exercise in the future and look forward to carrying on as Compatriot Jack Irvin has done in the past.
