

Pearl Harbor Day Activity

The St. Lucie River Chapter, SAR participated in the Pearl Harbor Commemoration Ceremony held at Veterans Memorial Park in Port St. Lucie on December 7th at 7:55 am. This year was extra special as it was the 75th anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor. The lone local survivor was not in attendance as he was at a doctor's appointment, his son said.




Compatriots in attendance included Jack Irvin, who provided the sound system, Jim Alderman (in Colonial attire), Carl Wade (in Navy uniform), John Auld, Chuck McKinley and wife, and soon to be compatriot Steve Laster.

During comments from the audience, Carl Wade asked all to share the significance of Pearl Harbor with others. Steve Laster recounted for the crowd his fathers injuries suffered in the Philippines. It is not common knowledge that an attack on the Philippines occurred some ten hours after the attack on Pearl Harbor.

As a note, Steve Laster's father is going to receive a cane for his loss of limb and capture in combat at the Purple Heart Cane Ceremony at the Seal Museum in Fort Pierce on January 21. The St. Lucie River Chapter, SAR will provide a color guard.

Liberty Tree Dedication

Compatriots Jim Alderman and Chuck McKinley were invited to participate in the dedication of the 37th Liberty Tree in the State of Florida. The Liberty Tree was officially dedicated on November 28, 2016 by the Caloosa Chapter, SAR with participation by the Sons of Liberty Brigade, the Lawrence Kearney Chapter, DAR, and Coral Ridge Funeral Home and Cemetery.



Chuck McKinley is the State Chair and Jim Alderman is one of the cochairmen for the State Liberty Tree Committee. This is the first dedication of a Liberty Tree since the St. Lucie River Chapter Liberty Tree at the Women's Club in Fort Pierce on March 28 in 2015. This Liberty Tree is a mature tree in the Four Freedoms Park located in Cape Coral, Florida. The ceremony was chaired by Compatriot Bob McGuire and was a National Event as SAR President General J. Michael Tomme was in attendance, as well as SAR South Atlantic Director Larry Fehrenbaker, past FLSSAR President. The ceremony was attended by the Cape Coral Mayor and the Lee County Commission, local DAR chapters, and the Caloosa Chapter Color Guard with live firing muskets. Many were in Colonial attire including our St. Lucie River Chapter attendees. Our chapter Liberty Tree Committee members will attempt to attend future Liberty Tree dedications whenever possible.

Detective Serra testified and Adams was convicted and was sentenced to LIFE."

They reveal the story of earlier generations of Americans who had both the vision to see a better world and the audacity to build it. The exhibit runs through Friday, 17 March 2017. -Each December on National Wreaths Across America Day, the mission to Remember, Honor and Teach is carried out by coordinating wreath-laying ceremonies at Arlington National Cemetery, as well as over 1,100 additional locations in all 50 U.S. states, at sea, and abroad.
